Many of us remember that in October of 1978, Pope John Paul II was installed as the successor of St. Peter. 1978 was an unusual year. On August 6, after serving as Pontiff for 15 years, Pope Paul VI died at the Papal summer residence at Castel Gandolfo. Cardinals from around the world gathered for the funeral rituals and to prepare for the Conclave to elect a new Pope. On August 26, Albino Luciani was chosen by the Cardinal-electors, and he took the name John Paul I honoring his two predecessors: Pope John XXIII and Pope Paul VI. He was the first Pope to adopt two names; additionally, he chose to include “the First” in his name. Usually, like our current Holy Father, Pope Francis, a Pope is not designated “First” until there is a “Second.” Although he was only at the end of his 65th year, Pope John Paul I died unexpectedly on September 28, 1978, just 33 days after he was elected. I was a sophomore in high school in 1978. I remember my dad waking me for school and telling me the Pope died. I told him that I knew that from a month ago. He quickly informed me that the *new* Pope had died overnight. Once again, Cardinals from around the world gathered to bury a Pope and plan for another Conclave. This time, breaking with over 450 years of tradition, the Cardinals chose a non-Italian, a Polish cardinal named Karol Wojtyla, to be the next Pope. He was elected on October 16th at just 58 years of age and took the name Pope John Paul II, following the example of Papa Luciani. The year 1978 became the “Year of Three Popes.” He served as Supreme Pontiff until his death on the vigil of Divine Mercy, April 2, 2005. In the days ahead, the crowds that gathered to honor him chanted “santo subito,” which means, “make him a saint quickly.” Pope John Paul II was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in 2011 and canonized by Pope Francis in 2014. Pope St. John Paul II’s feast day is October 22nd, the anniversary of his installation as Pope, so this coming Tuesday we will celebrate his memorial and call upon his intercession for ourselves, the Church, and the world. ***Pope Saint John Paul II, pray for us!***

I had the chance to meet Pope John Paul II several times. When I arrived in Rome as a seminarian in 1985, I shook his hand at the General Audience on my first Wednesday in Rome. On Christmas Eve, 1986, I was chosen to serve Midnight Mass at St. Peter’s Basilica, so I received Christmas greetings and a blessing from the Pope in the chapel that holds Michelangelo’s *The Pietà* after Mass. The day after I was ordained a deacon in 1989, he granted an audience for the newly ordained deacons and their families. I will always cherish the picture of my parents and me greeting the Holy Father at the end of the audience. A few years later, during a visit to Rome with another priest, we had the privilege of concelebrating with Pope John Paul II in his private chapel. When we had the chance to greet him after Mass, we told him we were from the Diocese of Brooklyn. He said: “Brooklyn ... very complicated.” My final encounter with Pope John Paul II was during his visit to our diocese in 1995 when he celebrated Mass at Aqueduct Race Track. I was a Master of Ceremonies for the readers at Mass, so I was seated in the sanctuary very near the altar. When it came time for Holy Communion, no one had designated a station for us to receive the Eucharist. I made eye contact with Monsignor Tosi and shrugged. He gestured to me to have the readers and me get on the line to receive Holy Communion from the Pope! Pope Saint John Paul II will always be very special to me.

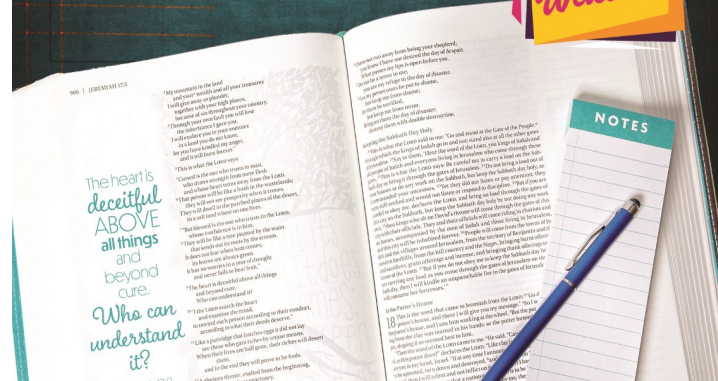

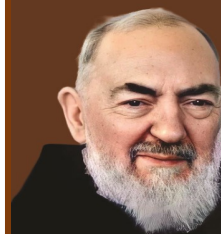

How to Pray the Rosary

Sorrowful Mysteries



-Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
2. Holding the Crucifix, say the Apostles' Creed.

-I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried;



- 1 Our Father
- 10 Hail Mary's
- 1 Glory Be

he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead: he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. 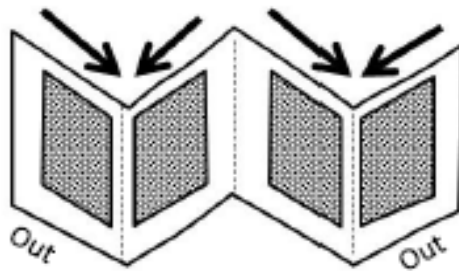


Book Assembly Instructions:

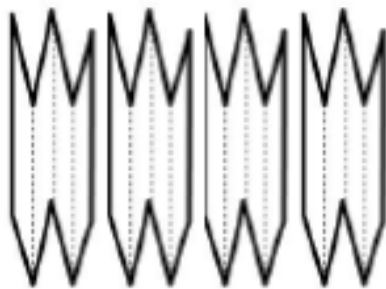
Note: If you wish to color these pictures, it's best to color them before you assemble the mini book.
