And just like that we are in the second half of November! Next Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, followed by Thanksgiving ... and then Advent begins. More and more Christmas commercials and programs are on television, and before you know it we will ring in the new year. Take time to breathe and pray as these weeks unfold. Keep God as a priority in the midst of trying to hold everything together as you prepare for the upcoming holidays.

November begins with All Saints and All Souls. It is customary during the month to celebrate a Mass to remember parishioners who died during the

past year. Next Saturday at 12:00 Noon we will celebrate that Mass here at St. Luke. If you lost a loved one over the past year, please bring a photo (no larger than 8x10) in a frame. There will be tables set up in the front of the sanctuary for the photos, and we will place lit candles around the photos as we remember our departed family members and friends. After Mass, Martha's Ministry will provide light refreshments. All are welcome. *Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.* 

As the liturgical year nears its end, the readings reflect on the end times. In today's passage, Jesus tells his disciples: "*But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.*" Since we do not know the time for our own death or the Final Judgment, Jesus encourages us to always be ready. Love God. Love your neighbor. Give generously. Forgive always. Show mercy. Be kind. Go to confession. Receive the Eucharist. These are all the traditional ways for Catholics to "be ready" for whenever and however the Lord calls us. These same themes continue when we begin Advent on December 1<sup>st</sup>.



On Friday this week, the Church celebrates the memory of St. Cecilia. Cecilia was born in the second century. She came from an extremely rich family and was given in marriage to a youth named Valerian. Cecilia, however, took a vow of virginity. At her wedding she sang in her heart to God to preserve her virginity. God sent an angel to protect her, and after her husband was sent to be baptized by Pope Urbanus, he was able to see the angel protecting his wife. He and his brother were dedicated to burying Christians who were put to death each day by the prefect of the city. Eventually they, too, were put to death as Christians. Cecilia spent her time preaching and converted over 400

people, most of whom were baptized by Pope Urban. In time, Cecilia was to be put to death. At first, she was to be suffocated in the baths. Although the fires were stoked up to unbearable temperatures, Cecilia did not even sweat. Next, an executioner was sent to decapitate her. She was struck three times but he was unable to behead her, so he left her bleeding and she lived for three days. People came to collect her blood while she continued to preach and pray. When she died, Pope Urban and his deacons buried her. St. Cecilia is considered the patron saint of music because she heard heavenly music in her heart when she married. In art she is depicted with an organ or organ pipes in her hand. Our choir rehearses every week in the St. Cecilia room. If you have a song in your heart, please consider joining the choir to help our community to joyfully lift up our hymns of praise to God!





On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas primas ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

Pope Pius XI's encyclical gave Catholics hope and—while governments around them crumbled—the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ "is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind" (Quas primas, 7).

Christ's kingship is rooted in the Church's teaching on the Incarnation. Jesus is fully God and fully man. He is both the divine Lord and the man who suffered and died on the Cross. One person of the Trinity unites himself to human nature and reigns over all creation as the Incarnate Son of God. "From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures" (Quas primas, 13).






